

**In her early teens, she found out she was pregnant. Not wanting to disgrace her family, Millicent ran away to the streets and gave birth to her son at the dumpsite.**

**She discovered the mother's program at MADE IN THE STREETS, started attending, and soon joined the boarding school. As a standout student in her Hairdressing class, she got the opportunity to receive extra training at Unity College.**
